

Wild Nunavut Arctic Turbot

Wild Arctic Turbot (Greenland Halibut) caught using traditional Hook & Line methods through the ice from Canada's Arctic province Nunavut. Greenland halibut belongs to the order Pleuronectiformes (meaning "sideswimmer"), and it has several features that distinguish it from other flatfish, namely, the position of the left eye (it has not completely migrated to the right side) and the colour of the blind side (it is dark grey rather than white). Greenland halibut thrive in the cold, Arctic waters and northern waters of the Atlantic Ocean, and are most plentiful wherever there are rich stocks of shrimp.

Arctic Turbot has dense rich sweet flesh with a tremendous fat content making it particularly appealing for sushi or sashimi but also excellent broiled as a comparable experience to Sablefish.
